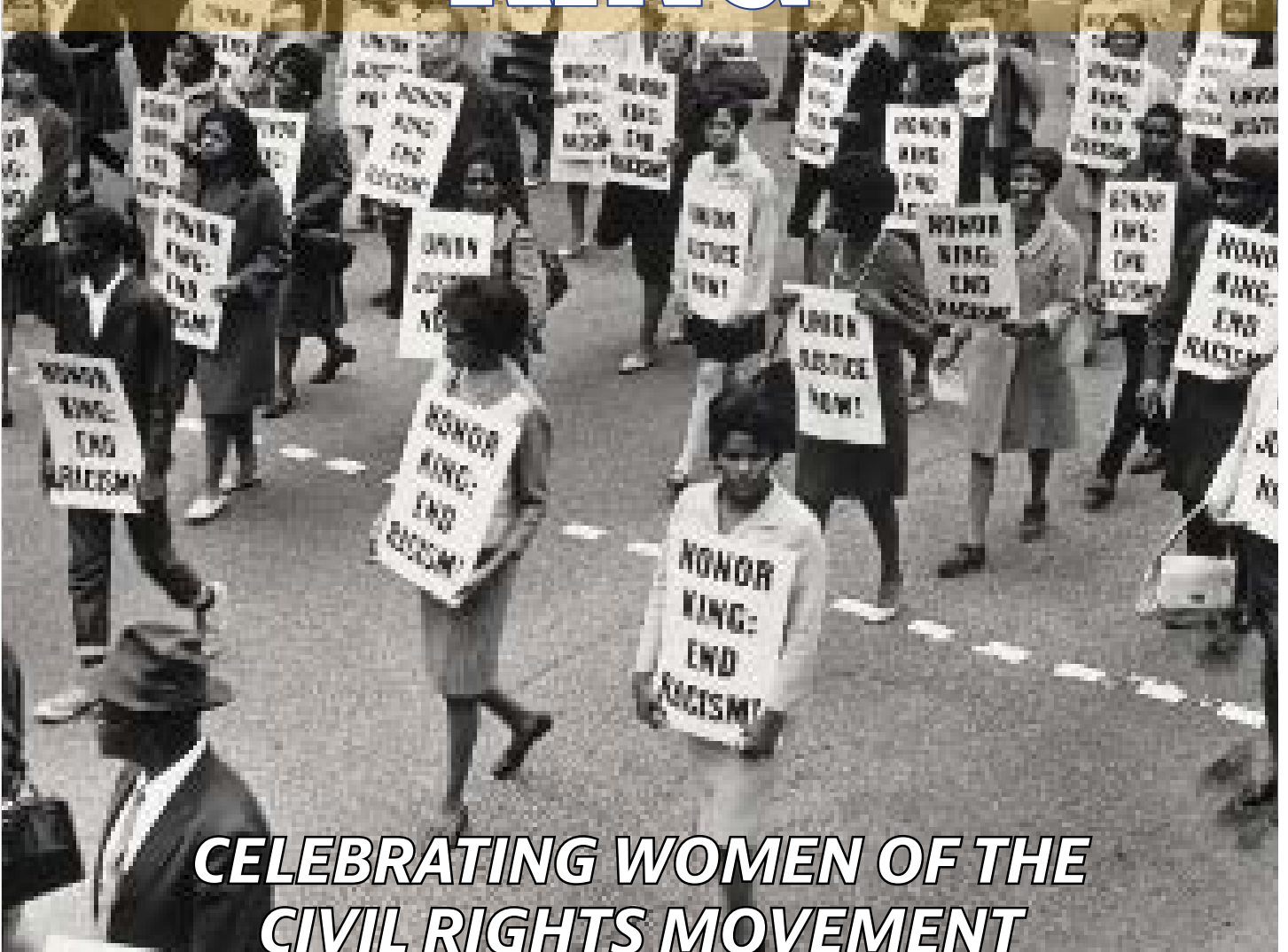

This multi-talented artist's domain knows no bounds. He is equally at home in an intimate cabaret setting or a large concert stage which he has shared with many seasoned performers such as Alicia Keys, Erykah Badu, Deborah Harry, Billy Ocean, Dave Coz, and Stevie Wonder just to name a few.

Since 2004 Sire has received an endless demand for his Barry White Tributes. When he joined the Pleasure Unlimited Orchestra in Germany, he felt honored enough to be a temporary replacement but has continued performing as the frontman to date for sold-out concert halls in Europe and throughout since 2009. 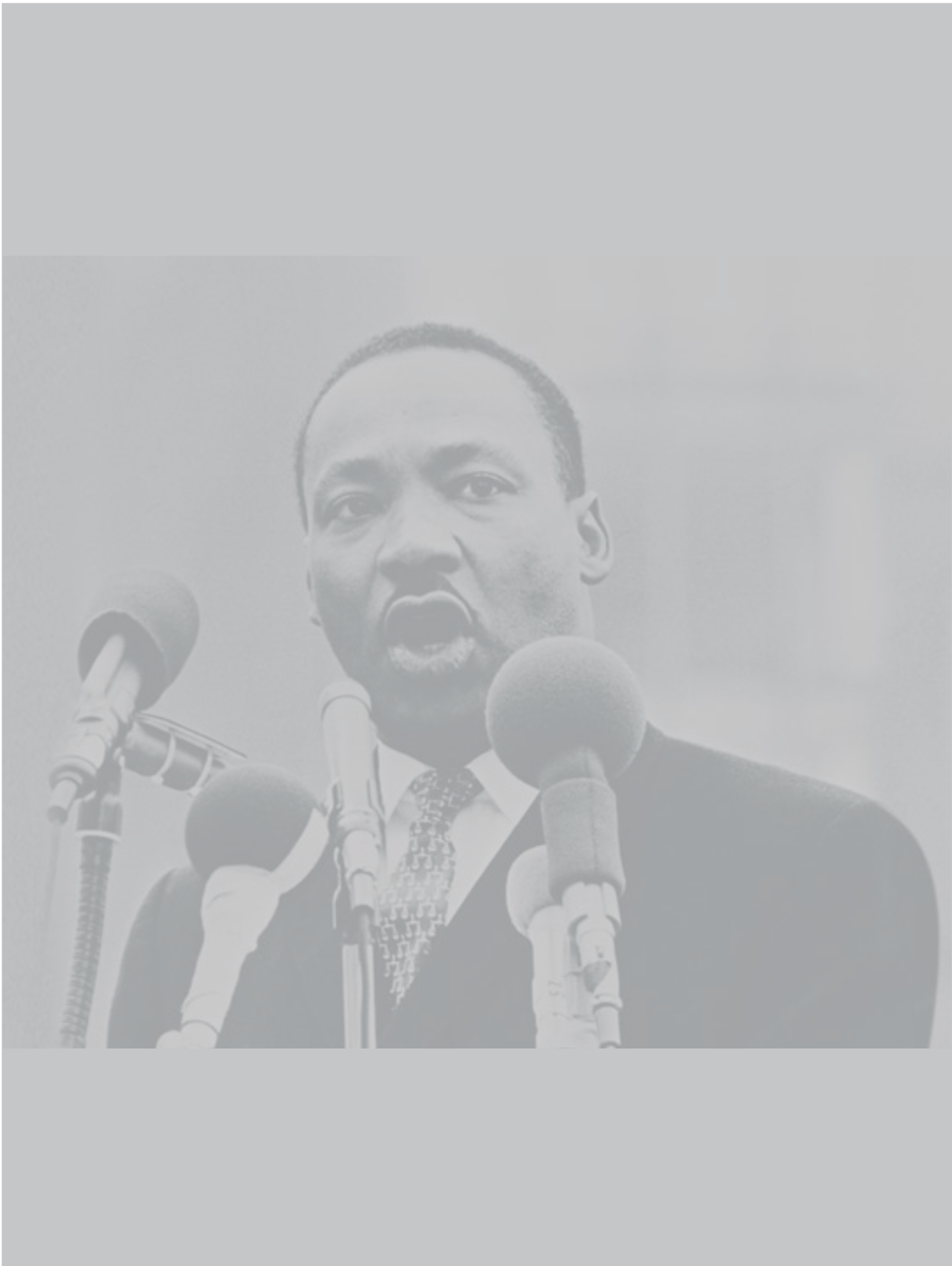
